A REVOLUTIONARY WAR ROAD TRIP



TRIP LOG

INTRODUCTION: A Revolutionary Day that traces British attempts for control of the Hudson River.

Early Morning — Mile Mark 0

<u>Kings Ferry</u>, <u>New York</u>: Kings Ferry was the southernmost crossing point on the Hudson for American personnel and supplies for most of the Revolutionary War. It was also a British target.

<u>Peekskill, New York</u>: Washington set up camp in Peekskill in 1781 and waited for French forces under the command of General Rochambeau.

<u>Garrison</u>, <u>New York</u>: Walk to a pagoda on the Hudson where you get a great view of the United States Military Academy at West Point and the former location of Fort Arnold.

Mid Morning — Mile Mark 20.8

<u>Cold Spring, New York</u>: Visit a small park that affords a close-up view of Constitution Island.


<u>Fishkill, New York</u>: Visit the former site of the Northern Department Supply Depot from 1776-1783 and the home of two of the oldest churches in New York State.

<u>Poughkeepsie</u>, <u>New York</u>: Visit two 18th century homes, the Glebe House and the Clinton House.

Late Morning — Mile Mark 70.5

Rhinebeck, New York: Visit Beekman Arms, the oldest, still active tavern in America. In operation since 1766, it was visited by George Washington in 1775


Red Hook, New York: Visit a town that has been extending its hospitality to travelers for over 200 years.

Clermont, New York: Visit the home of the Livingston family, including Robert R. Livingston who was a member of the Continental Congress and the committee of five which drafted the Declaration of Independence and the Chancellor of New York.

Early Afternoon — Mile Mark 91.9

Livingston, New York: Pass through the town of Livingston organized on the Albany-New York Post Road by Robert Livingston.

<u>Claverack</u>, <u>New York</u>: Pass by the courthouse where Alexander Hamilton and Aaron Burr once practiced.



Mid Afternoon — Mile Mark 118.0

Albany, New York: Tour the city that in 1777 was the target of a three-pronged attack from Lake Champlain, Lake Ontario and New York City.

Late Afternoon — Mile Mark 176.2

Saratoga Battlefield, New York: Take a tour on the battlefield toll road of the battles that became the turning point of the American Revolution.

Early Evening — Mile Mark 192.9

Schuylerville, New York: Visit the Saratoga Monument and Fort Hardy, where the British laid down their arms.

Saratoga Springs, New York: Visit the High

Rock Spring, the former home of American spy, Alexander Bryan and a place visited by Philip Schuyler, George Washington, Alexander Hamilton and Governor Clinton of New York.
